

Began COVID-19 testing for our community in November 2020 in partnership with the Renfrew County and District Health Unit, Renfrew County Virtual Triage and Assessment Centre, and Canadian Nuclear Laboratories

COVID-19 RESPONSE

Conducted COVID-19 testing for our staff, physicians, and their household contacts

Sought feedback on our organizational COVID-19 emergency response through two stakeholder surveys during the pandemic



Created an overflow inpatient unit to potentially receive additional patients to support regional health system capacity

Maintained activation of Emergency Operations Centre since March 2020



Adapted to rapidly changing vaccine eligibility and supply

Partnered with the North Renfrew Long-Term Care Centre to provide infection prevention and control support during the pandemic

Provided over 3,500 doses of COVID-19 vaccine at clinics for high risk healthcare workers and our community





COVID-19 RESPONSE

Implemented plexiglass barriers in a number of areas across the organization to increase safety for all

Provided dedicated Four Seasons Lodge staff and residents with both doses of COVID-19 vaccine in February and March to project against the virus



Completed emergency code education with a focus on COVID-19 safety

Continue to provide excellent compassionate services

Maintained safety of our healthcare workforce during the pandemic

Achieved the highest staff influenza vaccination rate in the region

Re-Launched Performance Appraisal process for staff as a formal process for regular feedback Improved accessibility of registration desk and outdoor sidewalks

Provided 12 days of Christmas give-aways and turkey vouchers for all staff to celebrate the holidays safely during the pandemic





SUSTAINABILITY


Year-end surplus based on LHIN agreement = \$979,719

Family Health Team transitioned to providing predominately virtual care, conducting 4,954 virtual appointments for patients to reduce COVID-19 transmission risks





INTEGRATION

Completed renovations and replacement of equipment in the Diagnostic Imaging Suite, which will include general x-ray, portable x-ray, ultrasound and ECG machines

Formed a number of new partnerships to meet the needs of our community during the pandemic, including those related to influenza vaccination clinics, as well as COVID-19 testing and vaccinations

Began transition to Epic Hospital Information System

Develop and expand internal and external partnerships and collaboration



Implemented infection prevention and contro measures to protect vulnerable seniors from the spread of COVID-19

Strengthen services for Seniors

38% of eligible Family Health Team patients had a mammogram 90% of eligible Family Health Team patients were screened for colorectal cancer

Refreshed dining and living space in the Four Seasons Lodge, including new dining tables and a fresh coat of paint Adapted visits safely to support residents and patients to have virtual and outdoor visits



SENIORS

807 Family Health Team rostered patients received influenza vaccinations through community vaccination clinics

Received allocation of 86 additional Long-Term Care beds to grow into a 96 bed Long-Term Care Home

Focused on You campaign reached the goal to raise \$1.75 million for Diagnostic Imaging upgrades, including a new x-ray, portable x-ray and ultrasound machine

Launched *Healthcare Heroes* Program to enable grateful patients an opportunity to highlight those who made a difference in their care at the Hospital, Family Health Team, or Four Seasons Lodge

FOUNDATION

\$12,400 grant received to bring high-speed fibre-optic broadband service to the organization in order to support patients and residents to communicate with family and friends as well as improve access to services available over the internet

Held annual **Trim the Tree** fundraiser virtually, where decorations were purchased to recognize a loved one and support the Focused on You Campaign

Raised over \$46,100 from round 5 of the *Catch the Ace* progressive lottery

Donated \$50,000 to refresh the Nursing Station and Triage Desk in the Emergency Department, and pledged an additional \$30,000 next year towards this project

Donated \$14,000 to support the Pre-School Speech Therapy Program in a virtual format

Held specialty sales for staff in the Gift Shop, while it remained closed to the public due to COVID-19

AUXILIARY

Since 1974, Auxiliary members have contributed 400,171 hours of volunteer time

Since 1974, the Auxiliary has contributed \$1,679,367

Decorated Four Seasons Lodge courtyard at Christmas so residents could safely enjoy the holiday cheer from a distance
