

Release of Information



The Board of Directors, along with members of senior leadership, spent the weekend of June 1 and 2 at a Strategic Planning Retreat to plan for the future of the Deep River and District Hospital, the Four

Seasons Lodge, and the Family Health Team. One of the objectives for the weekend was to reflect on where we are as an organization and the challenges and opportunities in our environment. The Board and Management Team also built consensus around the strategic themes, directions/priorities and next steps in the planning process. An update on our Strategic Planning process to date was provided to our community partners on June 18 and to all-staff on June 19th. More information will become available in the fall when the plan is finalized.



DUE JULY 31, 2018

Under the Long Term Care Homes Act, <u>all staff</u> of the organization are required to participate in annual education on a number of key topics. This education assists all of us in promoting quality, safe resident care and services.

The video: *"Resident Abuse and Neglect: A Presentation by Surge Learning"* has been assigned as Mandatory Education for all staff on SurgeLearning. This video covers a number of key topics including residents' rights, abuse and neglect prevention, recognition and response, and whistleblower protection. DRDH's Policy on *"Abuse and Neglect – Zero Tolerance and Mandatory Reporting"* has also been assigned for all employees to complete a review.

Recognizing the importance of this topic, this will be the primary focus for mandatory staff education this summer.






ALL-STAFF BBQ

LONG-TERM CARE CONFERENCE

The CEO of AdvantAge Ontario, Lisa Levin, provided updates on the state of Long-Term Care in Ontario and what she expects in the coming years.



Code Red – Fire Safety Plan

The Fire Safety Plan has been updated to ensure that the organization follows all requirements that are set out in the Ontario Fire Code. Thank you to the Emergency Preparedness Committee and the Deep River Fire Department for the time spent reviewing and recommending processes and changes. The next step is to practice, practice, practice! In the upcoming months, Sandra will be stopping by each department and run through some table top exercises.

In case of fire ...

- **R** Remove persons in immediate danger if possible.
- **E** Ensure the door (s) is closed to contain the fire and smoke.
- A Activate the fire alarm systems using the nearest pull station.
- C Call a CODE RED by pressing the CODE PAGING on any phone and page three times "CODE RED and FIRE LOCATION".
- **T** Try to extinguish the fire or concentrate on further evacuation

The order in which the responses occur may change depending on nature, severity and location of fire.

If the alarm goes off and no location has been announced, the Charge Nurse will check the annunciator panel and page the Code Red.

To use a Fire Extinguisher...

- P Pull the pin, twist the pin to break the seal then remove
- A Aim at the base of the flame, point the extinguisher nozzle at the base of the flame
- **S** Squeeze the handle, activating the extinguisher
- **S** Sweep the fire. Sweep slowly, side to side, front to back, blanketing the fire with the extinguishing agent, ensuring you discharge the entire extinguisher
