

FOOD BANK HIGHLIGHTS 2018

THANK YOU AGAIN TO EVERYONE!

We helped 162 children and 314 adults in 2018 We are here to serve everyone who comes, provided they live in our catchment area (Deux Rivières to Chalk River). We require photo ID for the first visit each year.

The usage of the food bank increased by about 3.7% in 2018. There was a decrease in families needing help within Deep River itself, and a small increase in the areas East and West of the Town.

We serve people who need short term help as well as people with longer term needs.

20% of the households who had visited us in 2017 no longer needed our support, but were replaced with an equal number of new clients. Half of our users made 1 to 4 visits, and 25% needed our help between 9 and 12 times.
